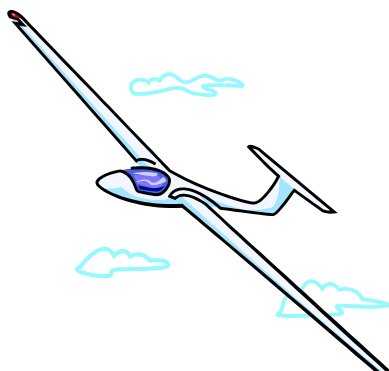

2014 CLGC Youth Grant!!

Deadline March 1, 2014!!

Applications are being taken for the 2014 CLGC Youth Grant of \$500. The applicant must meet all of the following requirements:

- Complete the application form (attached below).
- Be a member in good standing of the Chicago Land Glider Council as of January 1st, 2014 and,
- Be between the ages of 14 and 21 (inclusive) as of January 1st, 2014 and,
- Reside within 50 miles of Chicago and,
- Did not receive the previous year's \$500 grant (but you might win a secondary grant) and,
- Obtain a written recommendation from a Certified Flight Instructor Glider (CFIG) who is familiar with the applicant's qualifications and,
- Write an original essay of 500-1000 words on "What Soaring Means to Me..." and,
- Send all necessary documentation to the committee **no later than midnight, March 1st, 2014**

Anke Rudloff's First Solo

Park Forest South Aviation Group and Atlantis Soaring Society are pleased to announce that Anke Rudloff successfully completed her first solo flight at Lake Village Airport in Lake Village, Indiana, in a Schweizer 2-33 sailplane on her fourteenth birthday -- the minimum legal age to solo in gliders.

Anke, who is a freshman at Andean High School in Merrillville, IN, decided early on at age 12 that she wanted to solo in a glider. She has been working diligently towards that goal ever since, having joined the Women Soaring Pilots Association (WSPA) and attending the 2012 WSPA Seminar at Chilhowee Soaring Association in Benton TN, the 2013 Caesar Creek Youth Soaring Camp at Caesar Creek Soaring Club (CCSC) in Waynesville OH, and the 2013 ChicagoLand Glider Council (CLGC) Seminar in Elgin, IL.

Anke's diligence paid off on a blustery but sunny fall day which started with a 60 mile drive to the nearest FAA Examiner, Mr. Carl Timm, to complete the Student Pilot Certificate formalities. As it turns out, FAA Student Pilot Certificates are not handed out to 13 year-olds, so the

paperwork had to be completed early on the same day that Anke turned 14.

Although Anke was not permitted by the State of Indiana to drive a car to her appointment with the FAA Examiner on her 14th birthday, the United States of America did authorize the issuance of a Student Pilot Certificate so that Anke could be permitted to be Pilot-In-Command of a 1,300 pound aircraft.

With Certificate in hand, Anke and PFSAG crew Randy Wise and Paul Cantwell pulled out and pre-flighted the 2-33 while her dad, Uwe, prepared the tow plane. Anke's final endorsing Flight Instructor was her grandfather, Winfried, who's own first flight was also his first solo in a bungee-cord launched primary glider at age 15 in 1944 in Germany. After one more pattern tow together, both Anke and Winfried gave the thumbs up for the first solo, which Anke then completed flawlessly with an aero tow to pattern altitude under challenging crosswind conditions.

Assisting in Anke's endeavors at PFSAG also were Bill Helgersen, CFI-G, and Ted Sanders, CFI, with several flights in preparation for the big day.

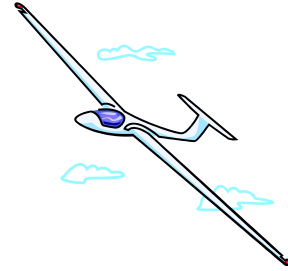
At CCSC Anke was instructed by Tom McDonald, Rich Carraway, Bob Miller, Chad Ryther, Dick Eckels, Chris Giacomo, and Lynn Alexander.

At WSPA at Chilhowee, Anke was instructed by Chuck Schroll, Mark Montague and Lukas von Atzingen.

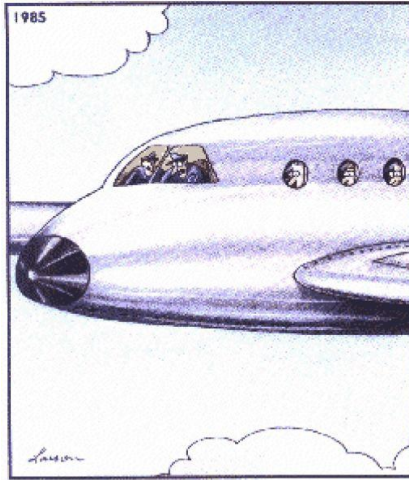
Many thanks go out to all of these dedicated soaring flight instructors and supporting organizations for playing a formative role in young Anke's personal growth. This shows that there is a tremendous community out there ready and willing to teach young people how to spread their wings and fly.

Also special thanks go to PFSAG's Walter Gleason Memorial Scholarship Fund which provided a generous scholarship grant to help Anke achieve her goal to solo flight.

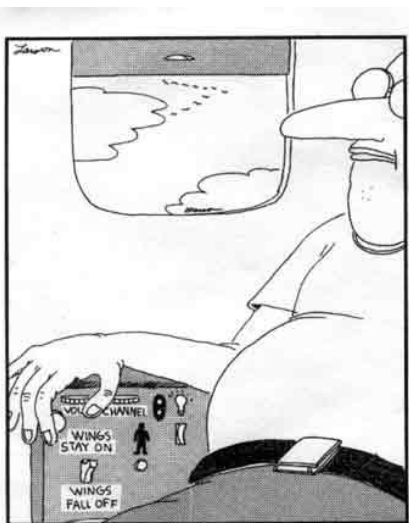

Sunrise & Sunset How it Affects Soaring

Have you ever wondered why soaring is better in the Spring? The weather in the fall is much like that in the Spring. So shouldn't fall soaring be about the same as spring soaring? So why isn't it?

It all has to do with how much daylight is hitting the ground! During our nice spring weather we have the longest days of the year. The longer the day, the more sunlight hitting the ground! The more sunlight, the better thermals! Not to mention that the longer days allow longer flight times.

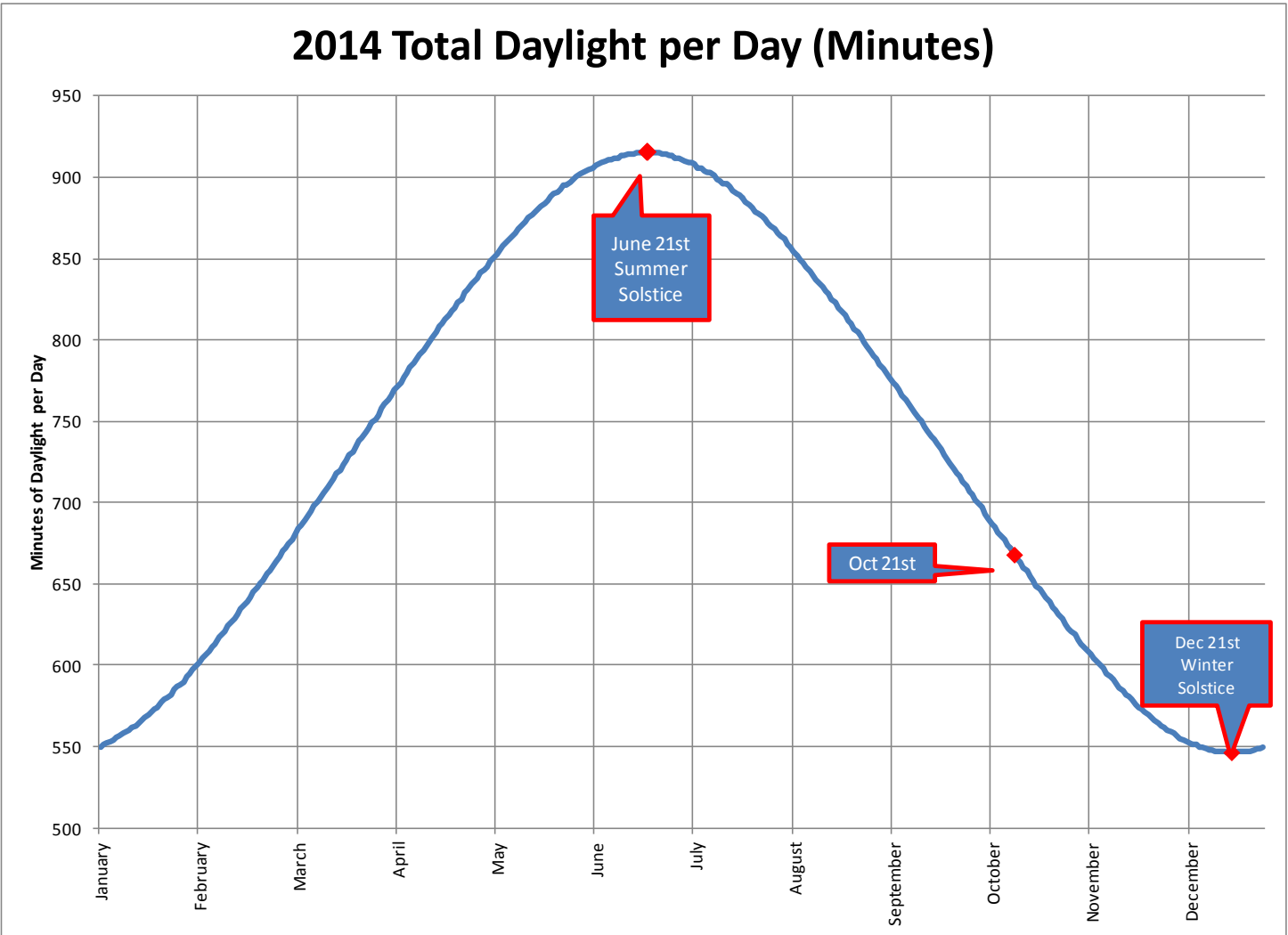
To determine just how much sun we get I gathered data from the great US Naval Observatory web site (<http://aa.usno.navy.mil>) to provide a table of sunrise and sunset times for the Chicago Area - actually

Hampshire, IL near Sky Soaring - which should be fairly representative of the Northern Illinois area.

I used the Naval information to create the chart I have included below which shows the total minutes of daylight per day for 2014. June 21st is the center of our longest days, while during the fall we have some of the shortest days of the year. The difference between Jun 21 and Oct 21 is 41% more daylight with long 15 hour days!

As you travel north the difference between the longest and the shortest days increases and, conversely, the further south you go the longest/shortest difference shrinks. For example, for the northerly gliderport for Sawtooth Soaring in Monroe, WA the daylight longest/shortest difference is 52% with a 16 hour longest day. For southerly Marfa, TX, the difference is a scant 25% with a 14 hour longest day.

My new plan? Move my soaring to Alaska!

2014 Soaring Youth Grant

The ChicagoLand Glider Council Grant program is hosted under the auspices of the membership of the council and is paid by their dues. A primary grant of **\$500** is awarded each year. Other secondary grant(s) may be awarded based on merit. This grant will be paid directly to the recipient's home soaring operation and placed "on account" for use by the recipient for their continuing soaring education.

Application Requirements: The applicant must meet all of the following requirements:

- Be a member in good standing of the ChicagoLand Glider Council as of January 1st, 2014 and,
- Be between the ages of 14 and 21 (inclusive) as of January 1st, 2014 and,
- Reside within 50 miles of Chicago and,
- Did not receive the previous year's \$500 grant (but you might win a secondary grant) and,
- Obtain a written recommendation from a Certified Flight Instructor Glider (CFG) who is familiar with the applicant's qualifications and,
- Write an original essay of 500-1000 words on "What Soaring Means to Me...." and,
