

# **CLGC 2005 Soaring**& Safety Seminar

Saturday, March 19th, 2005

#### You definitely should have been to this event!

The speakers were wonderful to listen to and the Elgin Community College site was something to behold. Eighty-Five pilots attended including fourteen new CLGC members. Pictures are shown below.

The day started off with a continental breakfast. Dennis Wright (SSA Executive Director) and with a panel of speakers (Jim Short, Rich Carlson and Steve Wasilowski) held a town hall meeting. After a short presentation by Dennis on the current state of the SSA, the floor was open for any questions that the attendees had. Many, many good questions were raised and the panel responded with clear and open answers. Everyone present recognized the importance of the two way dialog which occurred.

After the morning break, five time SSA convention speaker Dr Dan Johnson gave a fascinating talk about medicine, health, aging and how important it is to pilots. While the speech lasted for almost 45 minutes, the topic was so informative and captivating, the time was gone before we knew it. Gunter Voltz was inducted into the SSA hall of fame in 2005 and was duly recognized for his contributions. Others mentioned were, Judy Ruprecht (badge lady), Geoff Weck (Region 7 top badge awards), Rich Carlson (SSF Chair) and Duane Eisenbeiss (WDA).


Following lunch the *Soaring* columnist George Thelen ("Safety Corner") used a compilation of topics gleaned from the audience during the morning session to speak about the most important issues we have with that "Little red devil on your shoulder". Each attendee listed their top five concerns which were compiled by the Seminar staff. The top five concerns were; 1) Landing patterns, 2) Land Out Concerns, 3) Pilot overconfidence, 4) Health concerns, and 5) Flying Close to other Gliders, power, skydivers, gaggles, etc.

After the final short break the local team of Herb Kilian and Mike Shakman spoke at length about soaring competition and cross country flying. They spoke both to the contest "newbies" in the audience, those that have not flown cross country yet and the experienced pilots in the crowd. Very, very, very informative. # ChicagoLand Glider Council Youth Scholarships

Each year the CLGC presents one or more youth Scholarships. We all know that the youth is the future of soaring and we must foster their efforts as often as we can. This scholarship is your CLGC dues in action in a direct and positive way. The award will be presented at the April 19th final CLGC meeting of the winter season.

#### **World Distance Award**

Duane Eisenbeiss was recently recognized by the SSA for his work to "resurrect" this award. Below is a summary of the award. On January 1, 1992, the Soaring Society of America Board of Directors approved the World Distance Award. The purpose of the award is to promote and encourage cross-country soaring on a long



term basis. The award is presented to pilots who accumulate, through a series of cross-country soaring flights, a total of 40,000 km – which is equal to the distance around the earth.

There is no time limit for accumulating the total distance. This award is

conducted on the honor system. Turnpoints do not have to be declared prior to take off. No barograph or GPS trace is required.

Any reported flight distance must be greater that 50 km after being corrected for the difference between start and finish altitude as stated in the Guidelines. There is no documentation to submit other than the pilots yearly distance accumulation. The distance accumulation is to be reported to the WDA Administrator when each 5,000 km level is achieved or at least the end of each year. A one time registration fee of \$20 is required at the time of registration.

Certificates will be awarded to participants for each 5,000 km distance level achieved and the name of pilot will be reported in *Soaring* magazine. Upon achieving 40,000 km, a loop in the shape of an orbit of the earth, will be made available to the pilot at a nominal cost. This loop is designed to attach to any FAI Silver, Gold, or Diamond badge as shown above.

# 2005 Soaring Society of America Hall of Fame Inductee Gunther Voltz

#### **April CLGC Meeting!**

"Glider Electrical and Electronic Systems for Dummies"

Don't Miss It!!

April 19<sup>th</sup>, 2005

Did you always want to know how electrical power moves around your glider and how you can safely maintain all those complicated wires? John DeRosa will be talking about what makes your glider's electrical system tick. This talk will give an overview about power wiring, batteries, switches, fusing, FAA rules and regulations along with the right and wrong way to handle your glider's electrical innerels.

Many people are leery of the complexities of the GPS and flight computers used in many modern gliders. The second topic will be an overview of avionics including transceivers, transponders, antennas, GPS, flight computers, PDA's, competition software and moving map displays. Special attention will be given to understanding how soaring flight computers, GPS's and PDA's interconnect and communicate with one another.

#### 1-26 Regatta - Beloit WI

On June 17, 18, and 19th 2005, Sylvania Soaring Adventures Inc. will host a 1-26 Fun Fly Contest that will include awards and cash prizes for the best scores in four different events. These events will be:

- 1. Maximum Altitude Gain from release
- 2. Short Field Landing
- 3. Maximum single cross country flight distance
- 4. Maximum duration from a 3000 foot tow

Contestants will choose the time and the day during the contest that they attempt each event, and each event can be attempted as many times as the contestant wishes. The best altitude/ time/distance of the flights will count towards the contest score in that event.

The requirements are that you use a Schweizer 1-26 and show proof of insurance, pilots license, and a current flight review. Scoring will be very easy basically following badge rules with barographs and cameras or GPS data loggers. But, non secure GPS traces such as are allowed in the 1-26 Championships are also ok so long as we can import them into SeeYou or a similar program.

If you don't have a 1-26, you can sign up to rent our 1-26E. We will also have up to 4 barographs available for rental.

Social events will include cookouts hosted by Sylvania Soaring Adventures Inc. and a live band for Saturday night. Last year we hosted an event that featured a local Bluegrass Band and we hope to get them back this year. They were amazing!

Primitive camping is available on the field, but we will have showers set up. Also, there are lots of hotels within 5 minutes of the field, and many good restaurants close by.

We will be able to handle up to 20 entrants (first come first served...so let us know early if you can attend), with tows for practice or just to get to know the area, starting on June 16th. There is no entry fee or cost other than to pay for your tows. If you don't have a crew, our staff will happily assist you with assembly and disassembly, and retrievals if prior arrangements are made. We have plenty of area for tying down your ship and trailer parking (just bring your own anchors).

So, bring your 1-26 (if necessary...beg, borrow, or abscond with one) to the prettiest little airport in SE Wisconsin for a really great weekend of camping, flying, food and fun. 
